I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. REGISTRATION, ROLL CALL AND INSPECTION

Roll call is the time when participants are expected to check-in by –check-in is followed by inspection for fitness, lameness or “in season” females.

FOR THESE EVENTS WE WILL BE HOLDING A “ROLLING ROLL CALL” WHEN YOU ARE READY TO RUN YOU COME AND WE WILL CHECK YOUR DOG AND PUT YOU ON THE ORDER OF GO LIST. PRE- ENTERED DOGS WILL ALREADY BE ON THE LIST BUT MUST STILL CHECK-IN.

Rolling Roll Call begins at 8:30 each day for the MORNING events and **11:30 for the AFTERNOON events.**

What is the Fast CAT?

Fast CAT is open to all dogs 12 months of age or older that are individually registered/listed with the AKC registration as purebreds, Foundation Stock Service (FSS) dogs, dogs & AKC Canine Partners. Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.

The Fast CAT is a timed straight race of 100 yards where a dog chases a lure. Dogs are run singularly and earn points based on their handicapped speed. There are no placements. Titles are issued at designated benchmarks. The dog's time to complete the 100 yard dash is converted into MPH. Dogs earn points based on their handicapped speed. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

18" or greater = handicap is 1.0, 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5, Below 12" = handicap is 2.0
Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap

Titles are earned by accumulating points. The following titles will be awarded:

BCAT=150 points DCAT=500 points FCAT=1,000 points FCAT# = every additional 500 points.

Each dog that passes the test will receive a ribbon that is light blue in color.

Top 20 by Breed by Year: The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNERS SOLE RISK

Each dog requires an individual entry form for each event in which it is entered.

Entries will not be accepted without fees, signatures, or the “Agreement” found on the Official AKC Entry Form

Each dog entry will be inspected for lameness, fitness to compete and females in season. If, in the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to safely compete or a female in season, that dog shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded. Mixed breeds must be spayed or neutered to be eligible to run. AKC registered dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered.

For members of the Field Committee only, dogs may be accepted for roll call prior to the published time. Early acceptance of dogs for members of the field committee may begin one-half hour prior to published test hours

Battery powered, continuous loop lure machines will be used. The lure will consist of plastic strips. Only the Lure Operator, Huntmaster, Judges and Handlers of the hounds running in the course in progress will be permitted near the lure machine. The members of the Brevard County Kennel Club reserve the right to alter the course plan as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the test. The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore he is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, he has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog. Any person, upon reasonable complaint, be asked to leave the grounds of the field trial by the Field Committee and may be disciplined by the AKC. Children must be under control of their parent(s) or guardian(s) at all times.

A \$5.00 fine will be assessed on the owner or handler of any dog loose on the field but not competing in the course in progress.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

Persons exhibit conduct detrimental to the AKC/BKC/any dog(s)/other person(s) will be asked to leave the trial site.

No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.

The event-hosting club, its agents, members, representatives, and volunteers assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.

TIPS FOR HANDLERS

1. The field is fenced. However, it is strongly recommended that prior to running your dog, you have good “recall” control over your dog, as the dogs will be off leash.
2. Handlers should wear comfortable shoes and be physically able to hold and release their dogs, as well as catch them.
3. Dogs will be brought to the start line on leash and released only upon a verbal signal (“Tally-Ho!”) from the Huntmaster. Dogs may be released by hand, folded leash or using a traditional lure coursing slip lead.
4. Handler should have someone familiar with the dog at the end of the course to retrieve the dog or have someone else release their dog at the start line. The handler is expected to promptly secure the dog and leave the field with the dog on leash.
5. Lure coursing is a physically demanding sport so please make sure your dog is in good shape. If you are not sure, make an appointment with a veterinarian to get an opinion.
6. Handlers are advised to warm up their dogs prior to their run and walk them for about 10 minutes afterwards.
7. Any person, upon reasonable complaint, may be asked to leave the grounds of the test by the Field Committee and may be disciplined by the AKC. Children must be under control of their parents or guardian(s) at all times.

Hotels are nearby in Cocoa and Titusville and RV Parking: is available at the The Great Outdoors in Titusville. Please clean your rooms & pick up grounds after your dogs in order to insure use of these facilities in the future

Directions to the Trial:

From I95 North bound—take the exit for SR 524 Exit 202 toward Cocoa. Then 0.24 miles keep left to take the ramp toward Orlando. Then 0.02 miles Turn left onto FL-524/State Road 524. Then 1.15 miles. 6071 State Road 524 is on the left.
